
#### Leroy Braun, VA3LB SK

#### WIRES-x PARROT by John VA3WM

There has been a lot of excitement in the wires-x rooms about operators with high audio levels and overmodulated signals. For the most part, these signals are coming from operators on bridged DMR, YSF and FCS networks that operate at the mercy of whoever setup the bridge into the wires-x network. The bridges do not offer signal levelling when transcoding between networks.

Interesting that Yaesu's North American Sales Manager, John Kruk N9UPC, seems to want the problem to go away by casting 'spots' in a negative light and even suggesting blocking bridged connections into the wires-x network. Yes, this would solve the problem, but will just upset hams that like to experiment and drive them away.

Another opinion that keeps being beaten to death in the SystemFusion.groups.io forum is the lack of a Parrot capability (record your voice and play it back) in wires-x. Parrot/EchoTest exists in IRLP, EchoLink, DSTAR and DMR. Yaesu's John Kruk deflects this opinion by saying the distributed architecture of the wires-x network does not support Parrot capability.

Ah, then comes an innovative thinking Swiss ham, Martin HB3YDL, that posts on **Sys**temFusion.groups.io an equivalent to Parrot, but does not call it that per se.

#### Here's his method:

- I. connect to a wires-x node (any node will do, but suggest using local VE3RNR-room, rather than overexciting the AmericaLink room cops)
- 2. go to news station
- 3. push upload
- 4. select voice
- 5. speak your message
- 6. go back and push download
- 7. select voice, now you see the list with the messages
- 8. select your message and listen :-)

I have confirmed this works as advertised and may be helpful in your setting your mic gain.
