YUKON JAY, VY1JA, IS QRT



His medical problem was not disclosed in the report. His QRZ page says he went QRT on Sept. 14th and all his gear is for sale. Contesters and DXer's will miss his VYIJA callsign as a sought-after multiplier and zone. A group of U.S. amateurs who hold Canadian licences have been operating his station for the past four years remotely as VYIAAA. This will also have to come to an end. Gerry Hull, WIVE/VEIRM, who manages VYIAAA said, they are "sadden by the turn of events." And," Hams around the world will miss Jay." MINISTRY SEEKING COMMENTS Deadline November 4, 2019

Distracted driving regulations continue to be an area of interest for many Canadian Radio Amateurs. These regulations are made and enforced by provincial governments and can vary considerably from province to province and over time. In Ontario, RAC Directors Allan Boyd,VE3AJB (Ontario North/East) and Phil McBride,VA3QR (Ontario South) have been working hard on this issue. On December 15, 2017, the Ontario Ministry of Transportation (MTO) announced that the current two-way radio exemption for "Amateur Radio operators and specified commercial, public transit, and public function drivers was extended for a further three-years until January 1, 2021."

We are pleased to report that the Ministry is currently considering making the two-way radio exemption permanent and it has invited comments on this proposal as well as any additional suggestions or comments on how it could minimize distracted driving while supporting economic growth and prosperity in the province.

TO ALL AMATEUR RADIO CLUBS IN ONTARIO-SOUTH

The Ontario Ministry of Transportation has opened a 45-day consultation period to examine the possibility of making the time-limited exemption we enjoy under O. Reg. 366/09 that allows us to operate mobile <u>permanent</u>. The RAC Bulletin on this matter can be found here. Radio Amateurs of Canada will be providing an official response as a stakeholder shortly.

It took me multiple tries to get through the class to finally obtain my credit as I honestly had no use or want to know any of the stuff being taught. Now though, at my current age of 55, I fully understand the need for learning it.

One of my favourite "hobbies on the side" is Genealogy. I'm sure many of you know that genealogy is the research documenting of history. And to think I didn't see a need for history class. As it is, I've been able to trace my father's side of me back to the immigration and settling of the Acadians. They came to Nova Scotia back in the 1600's and this continued on for over 100 years. With Jim's permission, I am in the process of converting his book to what's called an e-book or digital book.
