President's Report - Stephen Riddle, VA3FLF



With few exceptions, every ham usually gets involved in a project that requires putting an antenna in the air and working at heights. In Ontario, the Ministry of Labour has enacted legislation with intent to protect workers from injury.

However having a friend or unqualified person help you put up a dipole or tower may put you in a liability position. A recent article in the Georgian Bay club's newsletter caught my eye and prompted me to share this information with NPARC members.

Property owner may be considered constructors and viewed as an employer. A reported injury could lead to a fine by a Ministry inspector and you could be found liable in the event of an accident. Unfortunately there have been too many construction accidents injuring workers and even fatalities and hence the legislation.

So when engaging help for your antenna project at heights, be diligent and ask some questions of your helper, including:

- Have you received work at heights training and are you certified?
- Do you have WSIB insurance?
- Do you have general liability insurance?

Letters From Bob Jones VE7RW (Previously VE3CTM)

NB: We received this email from Bob Jones during the summer. I had forgotten about it and read most of it at the November General Meeting. Those in attendance thought it would be good for everyone to see the entire letter in the Feedline.

Secretary Dennis, VE3XC

July 28, 2018

I was just reading in TCA about your upcoming 70th anniversary which brought back many wonderful memories. My name is Robert (Bob) W. Jones. I was born and raised in St. Catharines. As a young teenager, I was in a class led by Dave Flarity VE3DVE (SK) that prepared us to take the amateur exam in the Hamilton district office of the Department of Communications. Thanks to Dave and mentoring by people such as Jim Thompson, Howard Cowling, Cy Williamson and others, I got my licence as soon as I was able to take the exam. As I recall, you had to be 15 back then. I was already practising Morse code and studying for the exam when I was attending Maywood Public School and waiting to be old enough to take the exam. Those days led to obtaining a Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Electrical Engineering at U of T thanks to a scholarship from Blenkhorn and Sawle then a career in radio communications, first designing antennas at Andrew Antenna Company in Whitby and then responsible for spectrum policy and radio regulatory matters at the Department of Communications in Ottawa and finally as Director of the ITU's Radio Communication Bureau in Geneva after which I retired to Kelowna, B.C..

After retiring here, somehow Dave Flarity tracked me down and we had a sked on Echolink until he died. My wife and I managed to visit Dave and his wife once when we were back in the Niagara Peninsula. I wonder besides Jim Thompson if there are any other NPARC members from the late 50's still around?

It would be nice to attend the 70th celebrations but it is such a long way to come. Also, I have some matters here which will require my presence in September so I don't know if I can make it or not. I wonder if there will be a webcast similar to what the RAC does for its annual meetings?

Dave Digweed VE3FOI is a life member of the club and was there also. I know all the names you mentioned in your emails. I also was just a young kid when I was brought to the Club by Banner Edwards, VE3SU in 1965. Being a Welland boy early hams I knew were Phil Hudson, VE3BXK (VE3BAL), Al Hutchinson, VE3DNT, Red Hendry VE3BNW, Gino DiLeo VE3AHS, Len Cutress VE3TC (VE3DWL) all SK.

Perhaps we met at one of the meetings at the old firehall, or later at the library, or at Field Day in Niagara-On-The-Lake.
