If your call sign starts with VE3 you would use XM3. (Example VE3FOI would use XM3FOI) and if your call sign starts with VA3 you would use XL3. (Example VA3KGS would use XL3KGS). This is great for our area because of the Welland Canal being part of the Seaway, good PR for amateur radio,
