NPARC General Meeting April 12, 2018 Royal Canadian Legion, Fonthill Minutes taken by Dennis, VE3XC, Secretary

The meeting was called to order by the President Steve, VA3FLF

A moment of silence was called in remembrance of John Faber, VE3CNF

There was a round of self-introductions of those in attendance. Steve asked that each person also tell something interesting about themselves and something that everyone else might not know.

*Moved by Dennis VE3XC / Seconded by Jim VE3BCA: To accept the minutes of the last general meeting as printed in the Bulletin. Carried.

Treasurer's Report: Cash in the Bank \$ #1 attached + GIC \$ #2 attached + Petty Cash \$ #3 attached

Committee Reports: Steve pointed out that those reports were in the Feedline. Kevin VA3KGS said that the sign-up sheets for Field Day were at the back of the room. There are a good number of volunteers already. At the next meeting we will firm up the Band Captains and their crews. Band Captains are completely responsible for everything at their own station. Set-up Saturday June 23rd at 9am with start time of 2pm. Logs do not need to be submitted. Only the number of contacts needs to be submitted. Each station should use any logging software which gives the standard output file. Kaitlynn suggested N3FJB software for which she has purchased a club license.

Amendments to By-Laws: Steve began by saying that the changes had been sent out to all members, and was attached to the last Feedline.

Non-Members were asked to stand aside so that an accurate count of members present could be made. There remained 26 valid voting members with 18 in favour required for a 2/3 majority.

*Motion #1: As to NPARC and Niagara ARES co-operation: The amended item 3f, and the addition of item 7.3 and 14b. Two-thirds of the members voted for acceptance. Motion is carried.

*Motion #2: Concerning by-law wording, removing redundancies and pronoun usage. Two-thirds of the members voted for acceptance. Motion is carried.

Steve expressed appreciation to the by-law committee and all the work that they did. The revised by-laws will be available to the members on the web site. Additional work with ARES will need to start regarding formal integration.

Nominating Committee: Kevin VA3KGS and John VA3WM volunteered to form this committee. Steve noted that everyone presently on the executive with the exception of Lloyd, VE3ERQ as Vice-President has indicated they will stand for re-election in their present positions. The Committee will present its report at the next meeting.




